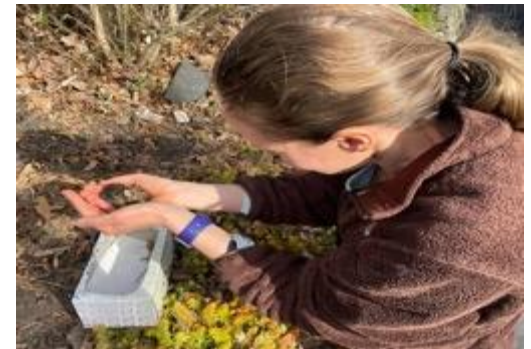


About Us

Some of our most amazing times together have happened while being active on **OUTDOOR ADVENTURES**. Like the time we were paddle boarding in the open water and a fast-approaching storm had us scrambling to get to shore. As we paddled around the corner of a small island, we came across hundreds of white pelicans floating on the water. As they saw us, the entire flock flew into the sunset, leaving us mesmerized. When we finally made it to shore, luckily escaping the rain, we were rewarded by gnats that decided we would make a great dinner. We frantically packed up our gear and laughed about it once in the safety of our vehicle.



WE LOVE WILDLIFE, but Chris does not particularly like critters and Nadege does not like insects. Having two cats and living out in a wooded area leads to both being found in the house at times. Chris is well trained on catch and release insect removal but relies on Nadege to do all other catch and releases. One summer evening, a thunderstorm blew in. Chris went downstairs to check on laundry when he noticed the window to the basement had been left open. As he was putting laundry in the dryer, he noticed a bird flying around smacking against the windows. He yelled for Nadege who immediately grabbed a towel, subdued the bird, and placed it outside where it flew away unharmed.



WE LOVE LEARNING ABOUT OTHER CULTURES. We always try to experience the local way of life. One time we rented a car in Scotland specifically for the experience of driving on the 'wrong side' of the car and road. Chris was very nervous leading up to it. Once in the car he realized he could just imitate what the other cars were doing by following the local traffic. All was well until we got to the country roads and there was no one to follow. Luckily Nadege was there to help remind Chris what side of the road to stay on by calling out at each intersection "stay on the left". Your child will be encouraged to experience and learn about a variety of different cultures and ways of life.



Nadege

Nadege's love of plants and gardening is due to the summers spent playing in her grandmother's garden. Today, Nadege continues to be a devoted plant mom. A couple years ago, there was a frost warning, and worried that her 'babies' would get too cold, Nadege pulled out all the blankets, sheets, pillowcases, and towels to bundle everyone up. When she ran out of linens, she went in and started to grab socks placing these on the ends of the branches. **THE BACKYARD TURNED INTO A LAUNDRY ZONE**, minus the washer and dryer. Chris thought she was a bit crazy but when the weather warmed up and the laundry was removed, the plants showed no signs of frostbite! Your child will learn the value of understanding how other living things flourish and how we affect their well-being by caring for them in good times and bad.



Nadege is crafty. **SHE LOVES PAINTING, DRAWING, AND PHOTOGRAPHY.** She often makes crafts for our family and friends. Nadege gets very involved with her crafts and sometimes has trouble finishing them as she always feels the need to add additional features. This seems to pay off as friends and family often display her art in their homes. Like the time she made a bird house for her mom. The bird house started off as a standard birdhouse, the kind you place outside, but once Nadege started to put the walls together, she realized that really the walls shouldn't be nailed shut but be held together by magnets for easy access and cleaning. The outside walls should be painted with the images of the seasons and lights should frame it. The roof should have moss to better camouflage it and wouldn't it be cute to add little figurines? Finally, the design became so elaborate that it would no longer work as a home for birds and only as a home decoration. It is currently on display at her mother's house. Your child will be encouraged to be creative.

NADEGE LOVES TO READ FANTASY, SCI FI AND HISTORICAL FICTION, especially when incorporates adventure and love.

One series she read was the inspiration for our trip to Scotland. After reading Outlander, Nadege was so enthralled with the main characters and the description of Scotland that she watched the Outlander series where she fell in love with the main character Jamie and the scenes of Scotland. She downloaded a map of where the show was filmed, had us travel to each of the locations, making us hike to remote areas and going so far as to have us stay at the inn where the characters have their first encounter. In the process, we ended up exploring the small villages of Scotland, learning about its history, and meeting locals.



NADEGE IS COMPASSIONATE. This is seen in the way she treats animals, plants and in the work, she does with kids and adults with disabilities. She helps them overcome behavioral challenges, learn new skills, and strives for them to have the same opportunities as non-disabled people. A few years back, it was her client's 55th birthday and for the special occasion her client wanted to bake a cake. Together, they gathered the ingredients and set off to make a vanilla cake with frosting, cherries, and chocolate bits. With support, he measured, poured, mixed, baked and once the cake was cool, decorated. He was so proud, he turned to her and said that this was the 1st time he had ever baked a cake. Your child will be given the opportunity and support to reach their goals.

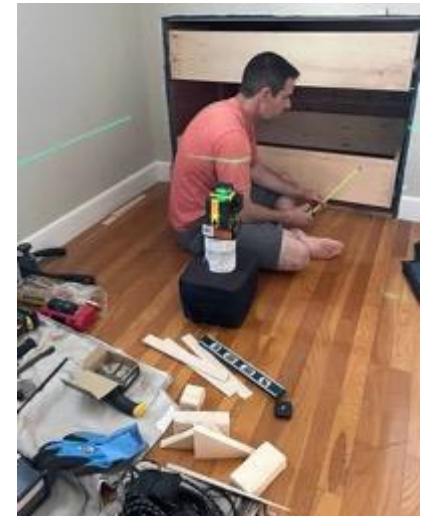


Chris

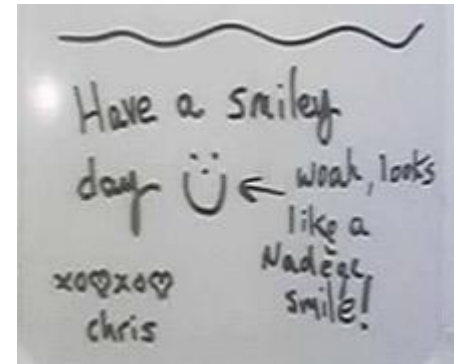

When Nadege was visiting clients, Hugo would come running up to her, jump on her lap purring and kneading, so she took him home.

Nadege's Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

wet:

1 3/4 cup softened butter (14 Tbs)
1/2 cup white sugar
3/4 cup brown sugar
2 eggs
2 tsp vanilla

Dry:

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp baking soda
1 tsp salt

"You pick amount"

semisweet chocolate chips*

*Recommend at least 1/2 the bag, can also pick other types of chocolate (white, dark, or mix different types)

Materials:

2 medium size bowls
1 mixer
measuring cup
measuring spoons
cookie sheet
soup spoon
mixing spoon

recommended:

nonstick tinfoil or parchment paper

Steps:

1. Set oven to 350 degrees F.

Get the cookie sheets, line with tinfoil or parchment paper.

Note: If you have neither, make sure to butter the pan so the cookies won't stick.

2. Measure and melt butter.

note: If you melt the butter in a small pot on the stove top until it turns light brown the butter will have a nutty taste.

3. Let butter cool slightly.

4. In medium bowl, mix all the wet ingredients (butter, sugars, eggs, vanilla) together until smooth and well incorporated.

5. In 2nd bowl, measure and mix all the dry ingredients (flour, baking soda, salt).

6. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients, mix until smooth. Should be 1 color (light brown).

7. Add the amount of chocolate chips you want to the batter and stir.

8. Using a spoon, spoon out the amount of batter you want. We typically do a soup spoon size. Leaving about 1 inch space between each cookie.

9. Using the spoon, flatten each cookie slightly- this will help prevent spreading.

10. Place in oven for approximately 10-15 minutes.

Cookies should be light tan, gold color on top. Remove immediately.

11. Eat and enjoy. Chris likes his cookies with milk.

Troubleshoot:

If the cookies harden- too much sugar or too long in oven.

If undercooked- too little time in oven.



Notes:
